New Destiny Treatment Center



History

New Destiny Treatment Center is a ministry of the Barberton Rescue Mission, which started in 1961 as a home where alcoholics and homeless persons could receive food, clothing, shelter and hope. In 1993 the Mission began a state-certified drug and alcohol treatment program. This program continues today in a 65-bed facility that provides nine months of residential chemical dependency treatment.

Program Description

The program offered in the treatment center involves an intense and well-structured schedule in order to accomplish its mission. The daily schedule begins with a 6:30 a.m. rising time and concludes with a 10:30 p.m. bedtime. The program includes psychosocial education, substance abuse education, twelve-step recovery classes, spiritual formation, group and individual therapy, computer literacy, basic education/GED readiness, medical services, case management and recreation/physical exercise.

Clients do not have visitation privileges or phone privileges for the first thirty days. They are not permitted to leave the grounds for ninety days, except when accompanied with staff for medical or court appointments. After ninety days, if sufficient progress has been made, the client may be permitted one overnight pass every other weekend.

Drug testing is administered on a weekly basis as well as randomly. One positive drug test is grounds for dismissal.

Clients are expected to perform work assignments each day as part of their daily treatment routine.

Each client is responsible for his own program.

Staff

New Destiny Treatment Center operates with a well-qualified staff. The staff is certified and licensed to perform treatment in the State of Ohio. The treatment staff includes a program director, a physician, nurses, certified therapists, case managers, a certified schoolteacher and additional supporting staff.

Population Served

New Destiny Treatment Center serves adult males between the ages of 18 and 60. The Center works in cooperation with all courts and agencies that are willing to cooperate with its goal and purpose for treatment. Many of the clients served by New Destiny Treatment Center are referred by courts to receive treatment in lieu of incarceration.

Treatment Costs

The current daily cost factor for treatment may be obtained by calling the office. This cost includes lodging, meals, clothing, toiletries and treatment. Prospective clients who are unable to pay for treatment may register for benefits through Ohio Dept. of Jobs and Family Services.



Admission Requirements

- Client must submit to screening interview conducted by a staff member.
- Client must be committed to nine months of treatment.
- Client must agree to comply with rules and regulations of the program.
- Client must be willing to conform to new behaviors and attitudes (e.g. no fighting, cursing, or using substances).
